

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR THE SUPPLY OF GOODS AND SERVICES

The Customer's attention is particularly drawn to the provisions of <u>clause 11</u> (Limitation of liability).

1 INTERPRETATION

The following definitions and rules of interpretation apply in this agreement.

1.1 **DEFINITIONS**:

- 1.1.1 **"Business Day**" means a day other than a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday in England, when banks in London are open for business.
- 1.1.2 **"Commencement Date**" has the meaning given in clause <u>2.2</u>.
- 1.1.3 **"Conditions**" means these terms and conditions as amended from time to time in accordance with clause <u>15.8</u>.
- 1.1.4 **"Contract**" means the contract between the Supplier and the Customer for the supply of Goods and/or Services in accordance with these Conditions.
- 1.1.5 **"Control**" means shall be as defined in section 1124 of the Corporation Tax Act 2010, and the expression change of control shall be construed accordingly.
- 1.1.6 **"Customer**" means the person or firm who purchases the Goods and/or Services from the Supplier.
- 1.1.7 **"Deliverables**" means any deliverables set out in the Order provided by the Supplier to the Customer in respect of Services.
- 1.1.8 "**Delivery Location**" has the meaning given in clause <u>4.2</u>.
- 1.1.9 **"Force Majeure Event**" has the meaning given to it in clause <u>14</u>.



- 1.1.10 **"Goods**" means the goods (or any part of them) set out in the Order.
- 1.1.11 **"Order**" means the Customer's order for the supply of Goods and/or Services, as set out in the Supplier's quotation and the Customer's written acceptance of that quotation, or overleaf, as the case may be.
- 1.1.12 "**Services**" means the services supplied by the Supplier to the Customer as set out in the Service Specification.
- 1.1.13 **"Service Specification**" means the description or specification for the Services provided in writing by the Supplier to the Customer as set out in the Order.
- 1.1.14 "**Supplier**" means Vapourtec Ltd registered in England and Wales with company number 04869183.
- 1.1.15 "**Supplier Materials**" has the meaning given in clause <u>8.1.8</u>.
- 1.2 A **person** includes a natural person, corporate or unincorporated body (whether or not having separate legal personality).
- 1.3 A reference to a party includes its personal representatives, successors and permitted assigns.
- 1.4 A reference to a statute or statutory provision is a reference to it as amended or re-enacted. A reference to a statute or statutory provision includes all subordinate legislation made under that statute or statutory provision.
- 1.5 Any words following the terms **including**, **include**, **in particular**, **for example** or any similar expression shall be construed as illustrative and shall not limit the sense of the words, description, definition, phrase or term preceding those terms.
- 1.6 A reference to **writing** or **written** includes fax and email.



2 BASIS OF CONTRACT

- 2.1 The Order constitutes an offer by the Customer to purchase Goods and/or Services in accordance with these Conditions.
- 2.2 The Order shall only be deemed to be accepted when the Supplier issues written acceptance of the Order at which point and on which date the Contract shall come into existence ("Commencement Date").
- Any samples, drawings, descriptive matter or advertising issued by the Supplier and any illustrations or descriptions of the Services contained in the Supplier's catalogues or brochures are issued or published for the sole purpose of giving an approximate idea of the Services and/or Goods described in them. They shall not form part of the Contract or have any contractual force.
 These Conditions apply to the Contract to the exclusion of any other terms that the Customer
- seeks to impose or incorporate, or which are implied by trade, custom, practice or course of dealing.
- 2.5 Any quotation given by the Supplier shall not constitute an offer, and is only valid for a period of three calendar months from its date of issue.
- 2.6 All of these Conditions shall apply to the supply of both Goods and Services except where application to one or the other is specified.

3 GOODS

The Goods are described in the Order.



4 DELIVERY OF GOODS

- 4.1 The Supplier shall ensure that each delivery of the Goods is accompanied by a delivery note which shows the date of the order, all relevant Customer and Supplier reference numbers, the type and quantity of the Goods (including the code number of the Goods, where applicable), and, if the Order is being delivered by instalments, the outstanding balance of Goods remaining to be delivered.
- 4.2 The Supplier shall deliver the Goods to the location set out in the Order or such other location as the parties may agree ("**Delivery Location**") at any time after the Supplier notifies the Customer that the Goods are ready.
- 4.3 Delivery of the Goods shall be completed on the completion of unloading of the Goods by the Customer at the Delivery Location.
- 4.4 Any dates quoted for delivery of the Goods are approximate only, and the time of delivery is not of the essence. The Supplier shall not be liable for any delay in delivery of the Goods that is caused by a Force Majeure Event or the Customer's failure to provide the Supplier with adequate delivery instructions or any other instructions that are relevant to the supply of the Goods.
- 4.5 If the Supplier fails to deliver the Goods, its liability shall be limited to the costs and expenses incurred by the Customer in obtaining replacement goods of similar description and quality in the cheapest market available, less the price of the Goods. The Supplier shall have no liability for any failure to deliver the Goods to the extent that such failure is caused by a Force Majeure Event or the Customer's failure to provide the Supplier with adequate delivery instructions for the Goods or any relevant instruction related to the supply of the Goods.
- 4.6 If the Customer fails to accept delivery of the Goods within five Business Days of the Supplier notifying the Customer that the Goods are ready, then except where such failure or delay is caused by a Force Majeure Event or by the Supplier's failure to comply with its obligations under the Contract in respect of the Goods:



- 4.6.1 delivery of the Goods shall be deemed to have been completed at 9.00 am on the fifth BusinessDay following the day on which the Supplier notified the Customer that the Goods were ready; and
- 4.6.2 the Supplier shall store the Goods until delivery takes place, and charge the Customer for all related costs and expenses (including insurance).
- 4.7 If ten Business Days after the Supplier notified the Customer that the Goods were ready for delivery the Customer has not accepted delivery of them, the Supplier may resell or otherwise dispose of part or all of the Goods and, after deducting reasonable storage and selling costs, account to the Customer for any excess over the price of the Goods or charge the Customer for any shortfall below the price of the Goods.
- 4.8 The Supplier may deliver the Goods by instalments, which shall be invoiced and paid for separately. Each instalment shall constitute a separate contract. Any delay in delivery or defect in an instalment shall not entitle the Customer to cancel any other instalment.

5 QUALITY OF GOODS

- 5.1 The Supplier warrants that on delivery, and for a period of 12 months from the date of delivery ("warranty period"), the Goods shall:
- 5.1.1 conform in all material respects with their description; and
- 5.1.2 be free from material defects in design, material and workmanship.
- 5.2 Subject to clause <u>5.3</u>, the Supplier shall, at its option, repair or replace the defective Goods, if:
- 5.2.1 the Customer gives notice in writing during the warranty period within ten (10) Business Days of discovery that some or all of the Goods do not comply with the warranty set out in clause <u>5.1</u>;
- 5.2.2 the Supplier is given a reasonable opportunity of examining such Goods; and



- 5.2.3 the Customer (if asked to do so by the Supplier) returns such Goods to the Supplier's place of business at the Customer's cost (subject to clause <u>5.7</u>).
- 5.3 The Supplier shall not be liable for the Goods' failure to comply with the warranty in clause <u>5.1</u> if:
- 5.3.1 the Customer is not up to date with its payment obligations under the Contract at the time of reporting the defect;
- 5.3.2 the Customer makes any further use of such Goods after giving a notice in accordance with clause <u>5.2</u>;
- 5.3.3 the defect arises because the Customer failed to follow the Supplier's oral or written instructions as to the storage, installation, commissioning, use or maintenance of the Goods or (if there are none) good trade practice;
- 5.3.4 the defect arises as a result of the Supplier following any drawing, design supplied by the Customer;
- 5.3.5 the Customer alters or repairs such Goods without the written consent of the Supplier;
- 5.3.6 the defect arises as a result of fair wear and tear, wilful damage, misuse, neglect, alteration, mishandling, abnormal working conditions or unauthorised manipulation by any person other than the Supplier's authorised personnel; or
- 5.3.7 the Goods differ from their description as a result of changes made to ensure they comply with applicable statutory or regulatory standards.
- 5.4 Except as provided in this clause <u>5</u>, the Supplier shall have no liability to the Customer in respect of the Goods' failure to comply with the warranty set out in clause <u>5.1</u>.



- 5.5 If the Goods comprise or contain equipment or components which were not manufactured or produced by the Supplier, the Customer shall be entitled only to such warranty or other benefit as the Supplier has received from the manufacturer.
- 5.6 If the Customer re-sells any Goods, the Supplier shall not be obliged to accept warranty claims under this clause from the end user. The Customer shall be responsible for any subsequent correspondence with and warranty claims from the end user to which the Customer re-sells the Supplier's products.
- 5.7 The Customer shall pay any shipping costs and expenses in the event that the Goods must be returned to the Supplier for repair, provided that:
- 5.7.1 the Supplier shall reimburse reasonable shipping costs where the Supplier finds that some or all of the Goods do not comply with the warranty set out in clause 5.1;
- 5.7.2 the Supplier shall not be liable for any loss or damage to the Equipment during transit from the Customer to the Supplier; and
- 5.7.3 where Goods are returned but are found by the Supplier to be compliant with the warranty set out in clause <u>5.1</u>, the Supplier may charge the Customer fees for the repair, inspection, replacement and shipping of replacement Goods to the Customer.
- 5.8 The terms of these Conditions shall apply to any repaired or replacement Goods supplied by the Supplier.

6 TITLE AND RISK

- 6.1 The risk in the Goods shall pass to the Customer on completion of delivery.
- 6.2 Title to the Goods shall not pass to the Customer until the Supplier receives payment in full (in cash or cleared funds) for the Goods.



- 6.3 Until title to the Goods has passed to the Customer, the Customer shall:
- 6.3.1 store the Goods separately from all other goods held by the Customer so that they remain readily identifiable as the Supplier's property;
- 6.3.2 not remove, deface or obscure any identifying mark or packaging on or relating to the Goods;
- 6.3.3 maintain the Goods in satisfactory condition and keep them insured against all risks for their full price on the Supplier's behalf from the date of delivery;
- 6.3.4 notify the Supplier immediately if it becomes subject to any of the events listed in clause <u>12.2.2</u> to clause <u>12.2.10</u>; and
- 6.3.5 give the Supplier such information relating to the Goods as the Supplier may require from time to time.
- 6.4 If, before title to the Goods passes to the Customer, the Customer becomes subject to any of the events listed in clause <u>12.2.2</u> to clause <u>12.2.10</u>, then, without limiting any other right or remedy the Supplier may have:
- 6.4.1 the Customer's right to use the Goods in the ordinary course of its business ceases immediately; and
- 6.4.2 the Supplier may at any time:
- 6.4.2.1 require the Customer to deliver up all Goods in its possession; and
- 6.4.2.2 if the Customer fails to do so promptly, enter any premises of the Customer or of any third party where the Goods are stored in order to recover them, at the Customer's expense.



7 SUPPLY OF SERVICES

- 7.1 The Supplier shall supply the Services to the Customer in accordance with the Service Specification in all material respects.
- 7.2 The Supplier shall use all reasonable endeavours to meet any performance dates for the Services specified in the Order or agreed between the parties, but any such dates shall be estimates only and time shall not be of the essence for the performance of the Services.
- 7.3 The Supplier reserves the right to amend the Service Specification if necessary to comply with any applicable law or regulatory requirement, or if the amendment will not materially affect the nature or quality of the Services, and the Supplier shall notify the Customer in any such event.
- 7.4 The Supplier warrants to the Customer that the Services will be provided using reasonable care and skill.

8 CUSTOMER'S OBLIGATIONS

- 8.1 The Customer shall:
- 8.1.1 ensure that the terms of the Order are complete and accurate;
- 8.1.2 co-operate with the Supplier in all matters relating to the Services;
- 8.1.3 provide the Supplier, its employees, agents, consultants and subcontractors, with access to the Customer's premises, office accommodation and other facilities as reasonably required by the Supplier to provide the Services;
- 8.1.4 provide the Supplier with such information and materials as the Supplier may reasonably require in order to supply the Services, and ensure that such information is complete and accurate in all material respects;



- 8.1.5 prepare the Customer's premises for the supply of the Services;
- 8.1.6 obtain and maintain all necessary licences, permissions and consents which may be required for the Services before the date on which the Services are to start;
- 8.1.7 comply with all applicable laws, including health and safety laws; and
- 8.1.8 keep all materials, equipment, documents and other property of the Supplier ("Supplier Materials") at the Customer's premises in safe custody at its own risk, maintain the Supplier Materials in good condition until returned to the Supplier, and not dispose of or use the Supplier Materials other than in accordance with the Supplier's written instructions or authorisation.
- 8.2 If the Supplier's performance of any of its obligations under the Contract is prevented or delayed by any act or omission by the Customer or failure by the Customer to perform any relevant obligation ("**Customer Default**"):
- 8.2.1 without limiting or affecting any other right or remedy available to it, the Supplier shall have the right to suspend performance of the Services until the Customer remedies the Customer Default, and to rely on the Customer Default to relieve it from the performance of any of its obligations in each case to the extent the Customer Default prevents or delays the Supplier's performance of any of its obligations;
- 8.2.2 the Supplier shall not be liable for any costs or losses sustained or incurred by the Customer arising directly or indirectly from the Supplier's failure or delay to perform any of its obligations as set out in this clause <u>8.2</u>; and
- 8.2.3 the Customer shall reimburse the Supplier on written demand for any costs or losses sustained or incurred by the Supplier arising directly or indirectly from the Customer Default.



9 CHARGES AND PAYMENT

- 9.1 The price for Goods:
- 9.1.1 shall be the price set out in the Order; and
- 9.1.2 shall be exclusive of all costs and charges of packaging, insurance and transport of the Goods, which shall be invoiced to the Customer.
- 9.2 The charges for Services shall be as set out in the Order:
- 9.2.1 the charges shall be calculated in accordance with the Supplier's daily fee rates, as set out in the Order;
- 9.2.2 the Supplier's daily fee rates for each individual person are calculated on the basis of an eighthour day from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm worked on Business Days; and
- 9.2.3 the Supplier shall be entitled to charge the Customer for any expenses reasonably incurred by the individuals whom the Supplier engages in connection with the Services including travelling expenses, hotel costs, subsistence and any associated expenses, and for the cost of services provided by third parties and required by the Supplier for the performance of the Services, and for the cost of any materials.
- 9.3 The Supplier reserves the right to:
- 9.3.1 increase the price of the Goods, by giving notice to the Customer at any time before delivery, to reflect any increase in the cost of the Goods to the Supplier that is due to:
- 9.3.1.1 any factor beyond the control of the Supplier (including foreign exchange fluctuations, increases in taxes and duties, and increases in labour, materials and other manufacturing costs);
- 9.3.1.2 any request by the Customer to change the delivery date(s), quantities or types of Goods ordered; or



- 9.3.1.3 any delay caused by any instructions of the Customer in respect of the Goods or failure of the Customer to give the Supplier adequate or accurate information or instructions in respect of the Goods.
- 9.4 In respect of Goods, the Supplier shall invoice the Customer on or at any time after completion of delivery. In respect of Services, the Supplier shall invoice the Customer immediately before the delivery of the Services.
- 9.5 The Customer shall pay each invoice submitted by the Supplier:
- 9.5.1 within 30 days of the date of the invoice or in accordance with any credit terms agreed by the Supplier and confirmed in writing to the Customer; and
- 9.5.2 in full and in cleared funds to a bank account nominated in writing by the Supplier, and time for payment shall be of the essence of the Contract.
- 9.6 All amounts payable by the Customer under the Contract are exclusive of amounts in respect of value added tax chargeable from time to time ("VAT") and any other applicable taxes and duties, customs duties or similar charges which shall be payable by the Customer at the rate and in the manner from time to time prescribed by law. Where any taxable supply for VAT purposes is made under the Contract by the Supplier to the Customer, the Customer shall, on receipt of a valid VAT invoice from the Supplier, pay to the Supplier such additional amounts in respect of VAT as are chargeable on the supply of the Services or Goods at the same time as payment is due for the supply of the Services or Goods.
- 9.7 If the Customer fails to make a payment due to the Supplier under the Contract by the due date, then, without limiting the Supplier's remedies under clause <u>12</u> (Termination), the Customer shall pay interest on the overdue sum from the due date until payment of the overdue sum, whether before or after judgment. Interest under this clause <u>9.7</u> will accrue each day at 4% a year above the Bank of England's base rate from time to time, but at 4% a year for any period when that base rate is below 0%.



9.8 All amounts due under the Contract shall be paid in full without any set-off, counterclaim, deduction or withholding (other than any deduction or withholding of tax as required by law or as expressly stated in the Contract).

CONFIDENTIALITY

- 10.1 Each party undertakes that it shall not at any time disclose to any person any confidential information concerning the business, affairs, customers, clients or suppliers of the other party or of any member of the group of companies to which the other party belongs, the terms and existence of the Contract except as permitted by clause <u>10.2</u>.
- 10.2 Each party may disclose the other party's confidential information:
- 10.2.1 to its employees, officers, representatives, subcontractors or advisers who need to know such information for the purposes of carrying out the party's obligations under the Contract. Each party shall ensure that its employees, officers, representatives, subcontractors or advisers to whom it discloses the other party's confidential information comply with this clause <u>10</u>; and
- 10.2.2 as may be required by law, a court of competent jurisdiction or any governmental or regulatory authority, subject (to the extent possible) to the provision of notice to the other party of such requirement.
- 10.3 Neither party shall use the other party's confidential information for any purpose other than to perform its obligations under the Contract.



11 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY: THE CUSTOMER'S ATTENTION IS PARTICULARLY DRAWN TO THIS CLAUSE.

- 11.1 Nothing in these Conditions shall limit or exclude the Supplier's liability for:
- 11.1.1 death or personal injury caused by its negligence, or the negligence of its employees, agents or subcontractors;
- 11.1.2 fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation;
- 11.1.3 breach of the terms implied by section 2 of the Supply of Goods and Services Act 1982 (title and quiet possession);
- 11.1.4 breach of the terms implied by section 12 of the Sale of Goods Act 1979 (title and quiet possession); or
- 11.1.5 defective products under the Consumer Protection Act 1987.
- 11.2 Subject to clause <u>11.1</u>, the Supplier shall not be liable to the Customer, whether in contract, tort (including negligence), for breach of statutory duty, or otherwise, arising under or in connection with the Contract for any of the following types of losses (whether those losses arise directly in the normal course of business or otherwise):
- 11.2.1 pure economic loss;
- 11.2.2 loss of profits;
- 11.2.3 loss of sales or business;
- 11.2.4 loss of revenue;
- 11.2.5 loss of contract;
- 11.2.6 loss or depletion of goodwill and/or business opportunity;



- 11.2.7 loss of anticipated earnings or savings or like loss;
- 11.2.8 loss of use or corruption of software, data or information;
- 11.2.9 wasted management, operational or other time; or
- 11.2.10 any special, indirect or consequential losses or damage, in each case, however caused, even if foreseeable.
- 11.3 Subject to clause <u>11.1</u>, the Supplier's total aggregate liability to the Customer, whether in contract, tort (including negligence), breach of statutory duty, restitution, misrepresentation or otherwise, arising under or in connection with the Contract (including any liability for the acts or omissions of its employees, agents and subcontractors), in respect of all and any loss or damage howsoever caused will be limited to the total charges paid by the Customer under the Contract in the twelve months prior to the liability arising.
- 11.4 The terms implied by sections 13 to 15 of the Sale of Goods Act 1979 and the terms implied by sections 3 to 5 of the Supply of Goods and Services Act 1982 are, to the fullest extent permitted by law, excluded from the Contract.
- 11.5 This clause <u>11</u> shall survive termination of the Contract.

12 TERMINATION

- 12.1 Without affecting any other right or remedy available to it, either party may terminate the Contract by giving the other party not less than one month's written notice.
- 12.2 Without affecting any other right or remedy available to it, either party may terminate the Contract with immediate effect by giving written notice to the other party if:



- 12.2.1 the other party commits a material breach of its obligations under the Contract and (if such breach is remediable) fails to remedy that breach within 30 days after receipt of notice in writing to do so;
- 12.2.2 the other party suspends, or threatens to suspend, payment of its debts or is unable to pay its debts as they fall due or admits inability to pay its debts or (being a company or limited liability partnership) is deemed unable to pay its debts;
- 12.2.3 the other party commences negotiations with all or any class of its creditors with a view to rescheduling any of its debts, or makes a proposal for or enters into any compromise or arrangement with its creditors other than (being a company) for the sole purpose of a scheme for a solvent amalgamation or solvent reconstruction;
- 12.2.4 a petition is filed, a notice is given, a resolution is passed, or an order is made, for or in connection with the winding up of the other party (being a company, limited liability partnership or partnership) other than for the sole purpose of a scheme for a solvent amalgamation or solvent reconstruction;
- 12.2.5 an application is made to court, or an order is made, for the appointment of an administrator, or if a notice of intention to appoint an administrator is given or if an administrator is appointed, over the other party;
- 12.2.6 the holder of a qualifying floating charge over the assets of the other party (being a company) has become entitled to appoint or has appointed an administrative receiver;
- 12.2.7 a person becomes entitled to appoint a receiver over the assets of the other party or a receiver is appointed over the assets of the other party;
- 12.2.8 a creditor or encumbrancer of the other party attaches or takes possession of, or a distress, execution, sequestration or other such process is levied or enforced on or sued against, the whole or any part of the other party's assets and such attachment or process is not discharged within 14 days;



- 12.2.9 any event occurs, or proceeding is taken, with respect to the other party in any jurisdiction to which it is subject that has an effect equivalent or similar to any of the events mentioned in clauses <u>12.2.2</u> to <u>12.2.8</u> (inclusive); or
- 12.2.10 the other party suspends or ceases, or threatens to suspend or cease, carrying on all or a substantial part of its business.
- 12.3 Without affecting any other right or remedy available to it, the Supplier may terminate the Contract with immediate effect by giving written notice to the Customer if:
- 12.3.1 the Customer fails to pay any amount due under the Contract on the due date for payment and remains in default not less than 30 days after being notified in writing to make such payment or;
- 12.3.2 there is a change of control of the Customer.
- 12.4 Without affecting any other right or remedy available to it, the Supplier may suspend the supply of Services or all further deliveries of Goods under the Contract or any other contract between the Customer and the Supplier if the Customer fails to pay any amount due under the Contract on the due date for payment, the Customer becomes subject to any of the events listed in clause <u>12.2.2</u> to clause <u>12.2.10</u>, or the Supplier reasonably believes that the Customer is about to become subject to any of them.

13 CONSEQUENCES OF TERMINATION

- 13.1 On termination of the Contract, however caused:
- 13.1.1 the Customer shall immediately pay to the Supplier all of the Supplier's outstanding unpaid invoices and interest and, in respect of Services and Goods supplied but for which no invoice has been submitted, the Supplier shall submit an invoice, which shall be payable by the Customer immediately on receipt;
- 13.1.2 the Customer shall return all of the Supplier Materials and any Deliverables or Goods which have not been fully paid for. If the Customer fails to do so, then the Supplier may enter the



Customer's premises and take possession of them. Until they have been returned, the Customer shall be solely responsible for their safe keeping and will not use them for any purpose not connected with this Contract.

- 13.2 Termination or expiry of the Contract shall not affect any rights, remedies, obligations and liabilities of the parties that have accrued up to the date of termination or expiry, including the right to claim damages in respect of any breach of the Contract which existed at or before the date of termination or expiry.
- 13.3 Any provision of the Contract that expressly or by implication is intended to have effect after termination or expiry of the Contract shall continue in full force and effect.

14 FORCE MAJEURE

Neither party shall be in breach of the Contract nor liable for delay in performing, or failure to perform, any of its obligations under the Contract if such delay or failure result from events, circumstances or causes beyond its reasonable control. If the period of delay or non-performance continues for three months, the party not affected may terminate the Contract by giving 30 days' written notice to the affected party.

15 GENERAL

15.1 Assignment and other dealings

- 15.1.1 The Supplier may at any time assign, mortgage, charge, subcontract, delegate, declare a trust over or deal in any other manner with any or all of its rights and obligations under the Contract.
- 15.1.2 The Customer shall not assign, transfer, mortgage, charge, subcontract, declare a trust over or deal in any other manner with any of its rights and obligations under the Contract without the prior written consent of the Supplier.



15.2 Notices.

- 15.2.1 Any notice or other communication given to a party under or in connection with the Contract shall be in writing and shall be delivered by hand or by pre-paid first-class post or other next working day delivery service at its registered office (if a company) or its principal place of business (in any other case); or sent by fax to its main fax number or sent by email to the address specified in the Order or as otherwise notified to the other party from time to time.
- 15.2.2 Any notice or other communication shall be deemed to have been received: if delivered by hand, on signature of a delivery receipt or at the time the notice is left at the proper address; if sent by pre-paid first-class post or other next working day delivery service, at 9.00 am on the second Business Day after posting or at the time recorded by the delivery service; or, if sent by fax or email, at 9.00 am on the next Business Day after transmission.
- 15.2.3 This clause does not apply to the service of any proceedings or other documents in any legal action or, where applicable, any other method of dispute resolution.
- 15.3 **Severance.** If any provision or part-provision of the Contract is or becomes invalid, illegal or unenforceable, it shall be deemed modified to the minimum extent necessary to make it valid, legal and enforceable. If such modification is not possible, the relevant provision or part-provision shall be deemed deleted. Any modification to or deletion of a provision or part-provision under this clause shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the rest of the Contract.
- 15.4 **Waiver.** A waiver of any right or remedy under the Contract or by law is only effective if given in writing and shall not be deemed a waiver of any subsequent breach or default. A failure or delay by a party to exercise any right or remedy provided under the Contract or by law shall not constitute a waiver of that or any other right or remedy, nor shall it prevent or restrict any further exercise of that or any other right or remedy. No single or partial exercise of any right or remedy provided under the Contract or by law shall prevent or restrict the further exercise of that or any other right or remedy.



15.5 **No partnership or agency.** Nothing in the Contract is intended to, or shall be deemed to, establish any partnership or joint venture between the parties, constitute either party the agent of the other, or authorise either party to make or enter into any commitments for or on behalf of the other party.

15.6 Entire agreement.

- 15.6.1 The Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes and extinguishes all previous agreements, promises, assurances, warranties, representations and understandings between them, whether written or oral, relating to its subject matter.
- 15.6.2 Each party acknowledges that in entering into the Contract it does not rely on, and shall have no remedies in respect of any statement, representation, assurance or warranty (whether made innocently or negligently) that is not set out in the Contract. Each party agrees that it shall have no claim for innocent or negligent misrepresentation or negligent misrepresentation based on any statement in the Contract.
- 15.7 **Third party rights.** This Contract is made for the benefit of the parties to it and (where applicable) their successors and permitted assigns, and is not intended to benefit, or be enforceable by, anyone else.
- 15.8 **Variation.** No variation of the Contract shall be effective unless it is agreed in writing and signed by the parties (or their authorised representatives).
- 15.9 **Governing law.** The Contract and any dispute or claim (including non- contractual disputes or claims) arising out of or in connection with it or its subject matter or formation shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the law of England and Wales.
- 15.10 **Jurisdiction.** Each party irrevocably agrees that the courts of England and Wales shall have exclusive jurisdiction to settle any dispute or claim (including non-contractual disputes or claims) arising out of or in connection with the Contract or its subject matter or formation.
